# RESOURCE AUTHORIZATION CATEGORIES

## Knowledge and Employability Resources

The resource lists for Knowledge and Employability courses contain learning and teaching resources that have been authorized for use in Alberta schools.

Alberta Education selects and authorizes resources to support the implementation of programs of study. Teachers are encouraged to select resources that meet the diverse learning needs of students they teach. The resource authorization categories are **student basic**, **student support** or **teaching**:

**Student Basic** learning resources are those student learning resources authorized by Alberta Education as the most appropriate for addressing the majority of outcomes of the course(s) or substantial components of the course(s); or the most appropriate for meeting general outcomes across two or more grade levels.

**Student Support** learning resources are those student learning resources authorized by Alberta Education to assist in addressing some of the outcomes of the course(s) or components of the course(s); or to assist in meeting the outcomes across two or more grade levels.

**Teaching** resources are those teaching resources identified as the best available resources to support the implementation of programs of study and courses; they may be teacher guides to accompany student resources or teacher professional resources. The authorized teaching guides are listed with the student resources.

These resources are organized by grade, authorization status and title in alphabetical order. Series names are italicized. Grade level(s) are indicated beside each title and there is a cross-reference column to other Knowledge and Employability subjects on the right side of the page.

**Note:**

Alberta Education strongly recommends that teachers read all selections in the student resources and all activities in the teacher guides prior to using them with students. Careful consideration should be given to the sensitivities of both the student audience and the community, and to the reading levels of students.

- This video is not inquiry-based. Breaking the video down into relevant pieces would be beneficial.

Students will gain a sense of pride for Canada's involvement in World War II and will understand the sacrifices Canadian soldiers made for their country. The video covers some of the outcomes in the Grade 11 Social Studies Knowledge and Employability course. The beginning and latter parts of the video will be most useful as a supplement to classroom instruction. These parts focus on the D-Day event and the impact this event had on Canadian veterans. The middle part of the video, the ceremony on Juno Beach and Prime Minister Chretien's speech, can be used separately to highlight the pride Canadians feel for their veterans. Throughout the ceremony, students can view the emotions of the veterans. Using archival material and contemporary film footage, the video briefly highlights the political, social, economic and environmental impact of Portuguese colonization that began nearly 500 years ago. In late 1974, the process of decolonization began. In November of 1975, East Timor declared its independence but was invaded, occupied and repressed by Indonesia in December of the same year. Resistance (pro-independence) movements are discussed against the backdrop of increasing repressive actions on behalf of the Indonesian government amounting to a brutal civil war. In 1999, the United Nations sponsored a referendum on the question of self-determination for East Timor. Despite the results in favour of independence, Indonesia stepped up the violence and massacres ensued. In late 1999, the United Nations and non-governmental organizations (NGOs) became involved in a mission to restore peace in East Timor and to support the movement toward rebuilding and independence. East Timor became a sovereign state in 2002.

This five-volume DVD set was created and narrated by Dr. Rick McDaniel, Director of the YMCA in Fredericton, New Brunswick. It presents multiple perspectives on the issues of globalization. The case studies presented illustrate the relationship between rich and poor countries and critically examine the need for creating a global equality. Terms and concepts are introduced and are clearly defined, and scaffolding of concepts is evident from one DVD to the next. Current information and statistical data is presented.

*Program 1: A Tropical Paradise* discusses conditions in developing countries such as the Dominican Republic, and defines what a third world country is. It also examines the 80-20 split, discusses free trade policies, provides a definition of Gross National Product (GNP) and compares the GNP of developed versus lesser developed nations.

*Program 2: Interdependence* outlines the interconnectedness of the global community and examines why developed nations need to be more conscientious of the issues affecting developing countries. While economic interdependence is examined, McDaniel also illustrates the intertwining of our world from a humanitarian stance, succinctly noting that health, peace, security and the environment are issues without borders.

*Program 3: Legacy of Colonialism* recalls the history of developing nations that were colonized or occupied and discusses the difficulties that these nations face in their struggle for autonomy, independence and economic prosperity.

*Program 4: Development and Debt* examines the issue of the Third World Debt Crisis, the factors contributing to the crisis, foreign aid policies and the impact of structural adjustment programs (SAPs) that were developed by the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the World Bank.

*Program 5: Where to Next?* clearly examines the serious challenges that face developing countries and also celebrates some of their greatest achievements. This component of the program discusses the possibilities that result from conscientiousness, involvement and action, rather than complacency. The contributions of community-based social development and the impact of non-governmental organizations (NGOs) are presented.

- The pace of the DVD components is appropriate and the quality of the DVDs is very good.

**Comments:**

- The vocabulary is difficult in places, but definitions of the most difficult terms appear in brackets, making the text easier to understand.

This documentary addresses several specific outcomes in the 10-1 and 10-2 curricula.

**Comments:**

*Global Cities* is a series of 30 minute videos that feature Toronto and London. The theme of each video is focused on economic globalization and its impact on global movement and immigration of peoples, changing the lives, policies, make-up and perceptions of people and cultures in cities around the world, such as London, Tokyo and Toronto. Each video begins with the following statement: "The globalization of the world's economy has brought with it the largest movement of people in the history of modern times. Everywhere millions of people are on their way to something new. No wall or barrier is strong enough to stop migrants as they cross international borders on a journey to where the action is-the global cities.

*Toronto: A World in a City*

In this video Toronto is presented as the most multicultural city in the world. This program investigates claims that multiculturalism is not really working and examines issues of culture, economic policy and immigration. Toronto is already addressing the process of globalization and immigration. More than half of Toronto's 4.5 million inhabitants were born outside of Canada. The program shows that as we enter the age of globalization, Toronto is a guide for the shape of things to come.

*London: The Imperial City*

In this video London is presented as a global city that attracts entrepreneurs, thousands of foreign migrants in search of good wages and a better future for their children or freedom. London is said to be a city full of risks and hardships for those migrants as globalization attracts them to the city for better wages and a different future.

**Cautions:**

- Previewing for content, context and perspectives is required by teachers prior to using all or parts of this resource with students.
- The "belief system" reflected in this material is that globalization cannot be halted and is changing the way the world is interacting and making decisions.
- The resources include a variety of personal beliefs about racial discrimination, acceptance of immigrants and their effect on the "host" society, religious beliefs and restrictions, gender orientation and terrorism related to Muslims.
- Some opinions are expressed that could be either sensitive to students or very inflammatory.
- Teachers will need to be sensitive about the context they place these resources in as they could reinforce stereotypes or encourage viewers to take sides rather than critically explore all aspects of the issues being discussed.

Each of the chaptered DVDs in the *Global Issues for Students* series presents a different topic and set of contemporary global issues. Each video contains some historical background, contemporary examples, different perspectives and points of view (largely presented via news footage and expert commentary) and possible responses to issues related to globalization. In each of the videos, a narrator guides viewers through this exploration.

The main issues examined are economics, the environment, science and technology, and human rights. Central topics examined include economic disparity, the spread of disease and use of the Earth's resources. Examples are global in nature, exploring issues in many geographical contexts. Two videos focus specifically on issues of globalization that directly impact Latin America and Africa in the 21st century.

A digital teacher's guide is included on each DVD and provides suggestions for using the resource in the classroom. It includes discussion questions, review questions and a vocabulary list. An online guide may also be accessed by teachers via the developer's Web site.

Six out of seven of the titles in this series are applicable to Grade 10 social studies outcomes related to globalization. To some extent, elements from Related Issues 1–4, from social studies 10-1 and 10-2, are addressed in each of these six videos, with the most emphasis being on treatment of outcomes in Related Issues 3 and 4.

*Africa: Challenges in the 21st Century* examines issues of globalization related to the history of Africa, the continuing effects of Africa's colonial legacy, the development struggles of some African nations and some improvements to quality of life. This DVD illustrates the causes, effects and possible solutions of other major issues; e.g., hunger, the pervasive problem of HIV/AIDS and the impact of controversial international trade policies that are seen to contribute to Africa's underdevelopment. This resource addresses General Outcomes 2 and 3, particularly Specific Outcomes 2.7, 3.5, 3.6 and 3.9, with some relevance to 4.5.

*Global Economic Issues* examines the benefits and challenges of economic globalization, the increased interconnectedness of the world economy and their impacts on quality of life. The DVD provides a basic historical context for the early wave of development of economic globalization. It explores a post-World War II tendency toward increased government control of the economy in some countries. The resource also examines such contemporary issues as the impact of economic globalization on different developed and developing countries; e.g., economic stability and economic systems, free and fair trade, wealth and poverty, resource use and the environment. This resource addresses General Outcomes 3 and 4, particularly Specific Outcomes 3.3, 3.4, 3.5, 3.6 and 4.10.

*continued*

*Global Environmental Issues* examines the positive and negative effects of industrialization and international efforts to manage economic development to protect the global environment. This DVD examines environmental issues related to industrialization; e.g., global warming, energy use, emissions, greenhouse gases, resource shortages, population growth. The video also explores how to balance the needs of environmental protectionism with sustainable economic development and growth. This resource addresses General Outcomes 3 and 4, particularly Specific Outcomes 3.7, 3.8, 3.9, 4.8 and 4.9.

*Global Science and Technology Issues* explores the digital divide disparity between industrialized and developed nations and the developing world. This DVD examines the positive and negative products of science and technology (e.g., information technologies, access to affordable life-saving pharmaceutical products, smart weapons, and genetically modified foods) on quality of life. It illustrates how industrial countries have come to rely on an abundance of technological and scientific advancement, while the developing world does not necessarily have access to either simple or advanced technology. This can impact their ability to succeed or compete with other countries that receive the benefits of technology. This resource addresses General Outcomes 3 and 4, particularly Specific Outcomes 3.7, 3.9, 4.3 and 4.8.

*Human Rights* examines the roles and responsibilities of individual countries, the United Nations and other organizations in protecting human rights around the world. The DVD explores the origins of the 1948 United Nations' Universal Declaration of Human Rights. This declaration outlines the universal human rights of all peoples that are seen to form a global foundation of freedom, justice and peace. This resource examines the strengths and weaknesses of the declaration, including the lack of international agreement on the definition of human rights or how to enforce them. The video discusses how some governments still take actions that discriminate against their peoples; e.g., disrespecting their social and economic rights, the use of torture, imprisonment without trial. Viewers are asked to critically examine the roles and responsibilities of individual countries and the importance of protecting human rights. This resource addresses General Outcome 4, particularly Specific Outcomes 4.1, 4.2 and 4.7.

*Latin America: Challenges in the 21st Century* critically analyzes contemporary issues of colonization in Latin America; e.g., origins, causes and effects. This examination includes the historical impact of the Spanish conquistadors and European colonizers on the economic disparity between the rich and poor. This resource addresses General Outcomes 2 and 3, particularly Specific Outcomes 2.9, 2.13 (10-1), 2.12 (10-2), 3.7, 3.8 and 3.9.

**Cautions:**

- This series of DVDs focuses on global examples of issues and does not directly reference Canadian examples or content.
- Teachers should preview the resource to check for appropriate context, given the potentially sensitive nature of issues related to globalization.
- *Africa: Challenges in the 21st Century*: Teachers should be aware of the inclusion of some potentially sensitive references, including poverty, racism, civil war, ethnic conflicts and AIDS.

A comprehensive overview of life in the Aztec culture is presented in a series of cartoons and drawings, with voice-overs and clickable icons. Timelines and simple maps are included, as well as a game to check knowledge gained. This resource could be used as bonus material for advanced students or as a resource for one or two students to prepare a report on Aztec life in the Grade 8 Knowledge and Employability Social Studies course. The CD is easy to navigate, although the multitude of choices could be distracting to some students.

**Comments:**

- There is no way to block access to the Egyptian and Viking parts of the CD, which may be distracting for some students.
- The movie theatre portion of the CD is quite static, with many drawings and readings, and not a great amount of action.

**Cautions:**

- Some aspects of Aztec culture presented may be sensitive for some students. They include such topics as mummification, violence, child abuse, human and animal sacrifice, cannibalism, and the use of drugs and spells to treat patients. Since this is an interactive game, it is more difficult to address these concerns than it might be if this were a print resource.
- Teachers should consider student and community values when using this resource.
- Class discussion is encouraged to address these concerns and to ensure that students understand the historical context of the relationship between the Aztecs and the Spaniards.

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The *Info Canada - Provinces and Territories* resource consists of a teacher guide and 13 student books covering each of the provinces and territories. Each province and territorial booklet includes nine sections: geography; history; government and society; people; industries; tourism and recreation; arts and culture; looking ahead; and things to do. Pictures and illustrations are bright, colourful and attractive and the font is easy to read. The teacher guide is filled with meaningful and relevant activities to help students gain an understanding of Canada. A detailed lesson plan is provided for each of the nine sections in each of the 13 student booklets. There are several cross-curricular activities, including activities in language arts, drama, science and the environment, mathematics, art, music, information technology and media. A variety of evaluation instruments are provided, such as a group discussion peer assessment checklist, a group work rubric and a research rubric. There are suggestions for differentiating instruction, such as teacher read-aloud, teacher-modelled writing, shared reading and writing, guided reading and writing, and independent reading and writing.

**Comments:**

- These resources present enough information to generate interest in the topics and to encourage students to conduct further research; however, they do not offer in-depth information. Additional research will be required to answer questions or complete activities.
- Teachers will need to clarify the use of the terms Aboriginal, First Nations and Métis.
- These resources provide insufficient historical and background information for students to engage in activities that include role-playing of Aboriginal peoples.
- Students need opportunities to engage Elders and to seek local community expertise in history and cultural knowledge. Students need to develop knowledge to distinguish and respect the cultures of the different First Nations, including such things as traditional games, traditional foods, languages, cultural traditions and cultural practices such as drumming, dancing and singing. These books do not include information on how First Nations structured their societies, including traditional decision-making, government, cultural practices and interactions with the environment. Also, background on treaty signings, such as what was agreed to, who signed, who did not and the reasons for these actions, is not adequate to portray the whole story.
- The teacher's guide refers teachers to the publisher's Web site for further activities. Web sites are not reviewed or authorized by Alberta Education. Teachers are encouraged to investigate Web sites before referring students to them.
- There are two areas of concern in the Saskatchewan booklet—the reference to free health care is not totally accurate and the section on biotechnology is not balanced, since only a positive viewpoint is presented.
- There are few references to people with disabilities.

*Issues for Canadians* consists of a student resource and a teaching resource and addresses the new Grade 9 (Canada: Opportunities and Challenges) curriculum outcomes in the Social Studies Kindergarten to Grade 12 Program of Studies.

The student resource leads students to think critically about contemporary issues in Canada, related to political and economic decision making, to develop an understanding of the impact that these issues can have on citizenship, identity and quality of life. To facilitate thinking about these issues, students examine such areas as governance and federal political processes, individual and collective rights, the justice system, immigration, and mixed and market economic systems and consumerism in Canada and in the United States. Students examine opportunities and challenges that these issues pose for Canadians.

An introduction to the teaching resource provides an overview of how both the student and teaching resources are organized, outlining their structure and function, including teaching strategies and approaches, a breakdown of features and program of studies outcome correlations for each chapter.

Following the introduction, the main contents of the teaching resource are organized to correspond with the chapters in the student resource; these teaching resource contents contain the following separate sections, organized by chapter: teacher notes and activities (including important comments and cautions for different chapters and suggestions for support materials located on different Web sites), teacher backgrounders regarding program concepts and student resource examples, sample questions and answers from the student resource, and reproducible handouts.

Nelson Canada supports the student and teaching resources through the *Issues for Canadians* Web site. The site is managed by Nelson and includes adaptable versions of all of the reproducible handouts and links to background and supplementary sources.

*Living in a Globalizing World* includes a student basic resource and a related teaching resource that have been developed by Oxford University Press in conjunction with Alberta Education to meet the new curriculum outcomes for the Social Studies 10-2 Program of Studies. These resource materials provide a springboard to address the key issue and outcome, four related issues and general outcomes, specific outcomes, and skills and processes for Social Studies 10-2.

Features such as Global Geography, Global Connections, Reading Guide, Voices, Web Links, Fast Facts, Media Smarts, and Explore the Issues, as well as formatting that includes larger pages and font sizes and visual organizers, add to the exploration. The chapters are organized into four main parts and main issues that correspond with the intent of the four related issues and general outcomes for the course: Impacts of Globalization; Effects of Historical Globalization; Implications and Consequences of Globalization; Roles and Responsibilities in a Globalizing World. Each of the four parts contains an opening piece. This opening piece includes a graphic organizer to introduce the main issue in the group of chapters and outlines the titles of, and the chapter issues for, the chapters. Each part also includes a closing piece that reflects on each grouping of chapters.

In the teaching resource, there are supports for the activities in the student resource and extensions that are intended to reach beyond these activities. There is an introduction that provides an overview of how both the student and teaching resources are organized, outlining their structure and function and including a breakdown of features and program of studies outcomes correlations for each chapter. Following the introduction, the main contents of the teaching resource are organized in the same manner as the student resource—around the four main parts, containing opening and closing pieces within each part and groupings of related chapters that correspond to the four related issues in the program.

The videos in this series provide firsthand accounts and personal insight into important issues and events in Canadian history. *Moving Experiences* explores issues of multiculturalism and the realities that immigrants have faced in Canada. In *Out of Sight, Out of Mind*, Japanese-Canadians describe the devastating effects of the Japanese internment during WWII, raising important issues related to civil rights and the nature of citizenship. In *Persons At Last*, four female activists discuss the effects of the landmark 1929 court case that finally recognized women as human beings under the law. *Women At War* describes the changing roles that women were required to take on during wartime, and the subsequent adjustment as men returned from abroad. In *Cruel Lessons*, four native seniors talk about the physical and emotional abuse they endured at residential schools, reminding viewers of the ongoing issues of cultural oppression and legal inequality. *The Great Depression* offers the stories of four seniors who experienced both the hardships and the sense of community that characterized the Great Depression in Canada. In *Pilots of the North*, former bush pilots describe their experiences trying to open up the Canadian North, recalling both the excitement and the danger involved. In *Hockey Lessons*, four French-Canadians discuss the Montreal riot, offering insight into possible reasons for this destructive event. *Home and Away* explores issues of national and regional identity as four seniors reflect on Newfoundland's vote to join Confederation in 1949. Each video presents personal interviews with four different individuals, interwoven with historical footage and photographs shown to an instrumental soundtrack. The videos are segmented into five- to ten-minute sections. Graphic organizers, discussion questions and comprehension questions are included in the teacher materials.

- *Cruel Lessons* deals with some sensitive issues, including sexual abuse and violence.

Students will be fascinated by discussion of human sacrifices, warfare and the rituals of the Mayan culture. Hector Elizondo narrates this video and does it in a well-paced and effective manner. The vocabulary and pace are conducive to learning. Teachers may wish to use this video in topic segments such as writings, religious beliefs, astronomy, language and death rituals since, at 60 minutes, it is too long to watch in one sitting. The video would provide an effective summary of a unit once students have a clear understanding of Mayan culture and societies of the past.

**Comments:**

- Teachers should preview the video for content, vocabulary and curriculum fit before viewing it with students.
- Care should be taken to establish the historical and religious context for Mayan practices, such as human sacrifice, ancestor worship and belief in the supernatural.
- The historical context for the clash between the religious beliefs of the Spanish missionaries and the Maya should also be established.

This resource follows three Canadian, teenage students who win a Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) contest by expressing their responses to global issues. As winners of this contest, the students are allowed to travel to Tanzania, Africa and work with Tanzanian students their own age. The Canadian and Tanzanian students live together for the duration of the project and work with younger children in a school in a small community. The Canadian students experience education in Tanzania as teachers of English and other activities. They also experience first-hand how Tanzanian children with HIV/AIDS are treated by their community and government. This experience increases their understanding of global issues and perspectives.

The DVD is presented from the students' perspective and presents ideas and issues that connect to General Outcome and Related Issue 4 in the social studies 10-1 and 10-2 programs of study. The resource also addresses such concepts as identity, active citizenship and quality of life in the context of issues related to HIV/AIDS and globalization.

The *National Geographic Student Atlas of the World: Teacher's Guide* is an effective resource for teaching current events in the classroom. It supports curricula at all levels in a peripheral way, but focuses particularly on Grade 10 Social Studies and the global economy. Activities have students reflect on the contributions they make that support their quality of life and the economy. Another activity looks at how wealth is distributed in a global economy. This resource also supplements the Grade 11 unit Canadian Nationalism and Global Issues with an activity that investigates how the world is increasingly becoming more interdependent. The teacher's guide is clear and the layout is easy to understand and deliver. There are a variety of activities that start out with simple concepts and ideas and then progress to more difficult ones. These activities encourage higher level thinking, analyzing and evaluating.

The softcover *National Geographic Student's Atlas* provides overviews and relevant information organized by continent. The format is attractive and colourful, with pictures of such things as geographical features, tourism sites, flora and fauna. The back of the atlas contains a brief factual summary of area, population, capitals, languages and colour flags of each country of the world, as well as a glossary of terms and a summary of world facts. This atlas would be a useful reference for all grades.

**Comments:**

- Content does not include information on the resources, politics or culture of the countries.
- Vocabulary and concepts may be too advanced for some students.
- Depending on their students' capabilities, teachers may need to modify or adapt the information presented.

This resource also covers topics such as Medicine and the Spirit World, War and Peace, the Sun Dance and The Great Bison. It contains pictures and diagrams of masks, statues, vessels, tools and other artifacts, and maps of cities and other historical sites.

**Comments:**

- Some First Nations people may consider the inclusion of the “artifacts” on pages 10–11 inappropriate at a time when sacred bundles are being repatriated and there is a desire to keep certain ceremonies and rituals private (i.e. Sun Dance). Teachers are encouraged to explain the religious significance of these ceremonies and rituals together with the respect with which the information must be held.

**Cautions:**

**Comments:**

- The video presents a large volume of information at a quick pace, making teacher guidance necessary throughout. This video would be most useful for reviewing skills that have already been introduced and taught in smaller segments, or for use as a resource in the mainstream library.

## Respecting Beliefs: Muslims, Christians, Jews & Other Religions

Developed by the Canadian Learning Company, this video introduces basic concepts related to Judaism, Christianity, Islam, Buddhism and atheism to illustrate commonalities and some differences among a few religions or belief systems of the world. The resource provides a brief interpretation of the historical background for each of these religions or belief systems, emphasizes their commonalities and supports respect for their differences.

Interviews with youth who have different religions or belief systems are central to this video and are linked together by a narrator. Information, questions for students and a five-part process for respectfully exploring various religions or belief systems are included on the screen during some of the interviews and as part of the narration.

The resource is accompanied by a short, printed booklet/program guide that includes brief background information and some possible questions/activities. Students can use the resource to develop a basic understanding of how the expression of a person's religion or belief system can impact how he or she views the world. This supports the Grade 8 theme of examining worldviews.

### Comments:

- This resource is a potential starting point for explorations of various religions or belief systems and of possible connections to people's worldviews. Overall, the video's religious categories tend to be simplified in order to make this topic more accessible for students. Each of the American youth interviewed in the video provides his or her own experience and understanding of his or her own religion or belief system; the youth provide an interpretation of religion largely as a set of cultural practices that they have experienced. No one interview is intended to reflect all people's beliefs within a particular religion or belief system or to be *the* set of "facts" about that faith. In the same way, the information given on the screen, in the narration and in the printed material is representative of one particular interpretation of a religion or belief system only and is not intended to reflect the beliefs of all peoples. Diversity within these faiths would need to be explored to reflect multiple perspectives about these faiths.
- For reference, some more specific comments and cautions are noted below to support use of this resource:
- In the video, the narrator states her own beliefs clearly, reflecting a perspective that somewhat equates culture as worldview. The narrator also presents a positive view of religion and belief systems, potentially based on the assumption that belief systems guide people's lives. The narrator and the video are focused on respect of belief systems and do not address elements of conflict or interrelationships among belief systems. The information about different religions is also generally presented from the points of view of youth/students. Further discussion would be beneficial in order to clarify and expand on their points.
- The placement of the religious symbol of the Christian cross in the centre of the title screen, surrounded by the Jewish Star of David and the star-crescent intending to represent Islam, could be seen as a value judgment by some. As well, use of the star-crescent to represent Islam is reflective of one perspective; it is not necessarily a widely agreed upon symbol to represent Islam and may not be accepted by some people of Islamic faith. Further, the video states that Muslims believe Muhammad to be the first Muslim; however, some people of this faith may have a different interpretation and believe this to be inaccurate. It is also important to note that the video reflects what some could consider an American perspective or interpretation of the belief systems it discusses. The video also implies that the status of atheism is parallel, as a formal belief system, to the religions discussed.
- The statistics and facts provided in the charts and in the narrative tend to be simplified, potentially to increase accessibility of the video; this sometimes provides room for interpretation on the source/accuracy of the information being shared, depending on the point of view of the viewer. For example, the first chart demonstrates that Christianity is the most widespread religion, but does not necessarily clarify that this includes both Protestants and Catholics. By some accounts, the most widespread world religion could be Islam, depending on how the statistics are compiled. As well, the video states that Judaism was founded

by Abraham 4000 years ago; this statement could be preceded in the classroom with the idea that this is what many Jews may believe. Teachers could point out that in the absence of any reliable historical record, some of the general statements in the video could be presented as articles of faith or perhaps sacred stories or beliefs. Additional sources and a discussion about perspectives could provide context for these statistics.

- The video contains an explanation for using the term *respect* in place of the term *tolerance*, including discussion of the connotations associated with each term.
- The video itself is somewhat dated in its presentation style.
- The program guide for teachers mirrors the contents of the video; accordingly, the comments and cautions listed above are equally relevant for the program guide. The sources for statistics and the definitions in the program guide are general in nature and would benefit from further discussion and contextualization in the classroom. Some of the suggested activities would be recommended over the true/false questions in the guide to engage students in thinking about beliefs and worldviews. Based on interpretation, some of the items in the definitions and fact sheet sections could also be seen as inaccurate. For example, in the definitions, in the description of Muslims and prayer, some might consider it more accurate to state that Muslims face the Kaaba in their prayers. In the fact sheet, questions over the following could arise: the largest religion in the world, whether Buddha was a god, countries that have an “official religion,” the country that has the largest Muslim population, beliefs of some “Native tribes” in the world, and the role of saints. In the references sections, the Web site listings are more supportive for teachers than the bibliographic sources provided.
- Teachers should consider further contextualizing the video materials in a Canadian, Alberta and classroom-specific context for their students. As part of this contextualization, teachers should be ready to supplement the video with additional materials about the faiths it explores (e.g., different types of Buddhist and Islamic faiths) and with materials on other faiths or belief systems, such as Hinduism, Taoism, Confucianism, Aboriginal or Indigenous belief systems, or faiths that are present in the school’s own community. Teachers need to keep in mind that any materials based on the topic of religion and belief systems could contain interpretations that may not be embraced by all people of a faith.
- When using this video, teachers should encourage students to engage in critical thinking about religion and belief systems and about potential links to specific locations and cultures in the world and to people’s personal and collective worldviews. Teachers may ask questions such as “What is religion?” “Are religions and belief systems expressed and interpreted in the same way in different locations in the world?” “Are there diverse groups within a belief system who express their beliefs in different ways?” “How can a person’s belief system and where he/she lives impact his/her worldview?” Providing this type of critical thinking context when using the video should strengthen the video’s support of outcomes for the Grade 8 program.

- Careful consideration should be given to the sensitivities of both the student audience and the community.

This resource combines history, geography, geology, science, ecology and meteorology in a set of five programs. *Air* focuses on Canada's diverse range of climates and how climate influences the way people eat, dress, feel and live in different areas of the country and at different times of the year. The video explores the damage that can be caused by the weather, highlighting the 1998 ice storm in eastern Canada. In *Fire*, the narrator explains how usable energy can be produced by solar power, uranium, water or burning coal. The video shows early forms of energy, highlights the importance of Alberta's petroleum and natural gas resources, and provides information on possible energy sources of the future. *Land* describes the diverse landforms and industries in each of Canada's six regions: the Cordillera, the Central Plains, the Canadian Shield, the Great Lakes-St. Lawrence River, the Atlantic and the Arctic. *Water* explores the many forms of water prevalent in Canada, from lakes to glaciers to waterfalls. The video features interesting trivia facts and emphasizes how the availability of water influences land use and development. *Life* deals with Canada's people, flora and fauna. It gives an overview of Canada's settlement, from the earliest nomadic hunters to the Vikings and European explorers, and discusses the impact of immigration on Canada's cultural make-up. The video also highlights native plant and animal species, and discusses how different animals have adapted to life in Canada. These videos combine several subjects under one theme and could be used to introduce materials, review topics or provide a starting point for further research. Each program in the set could be used alone or with one or more of the others. The videos are divided into short segments, making it easy to pick and choose parts as needed. The narration gives clear, relevant and interesting information. Maps and animation are used periodically throughout the videos. Each video is accompanied by a print summary of main concepts and a chart indicating how the video relates to specific topics and subject areas.

The stories deal with different geographical locations, and are thematically grouped into five types: seas, mountains, jungles, deserts and polar regions. Each story centres around historical figures (individuals or groups of people) who had to deal with a situation specific to their geographical location. The stories are written at an appropriate level and are engaging to read. The books include quality photographs or artist renditions, and full colour is used throughout. Each book begins with a world map isolating the locations found in the stories, followed by smaller, more detailed maps. These maps are accompanied by exercises to teach students how to read and understand maps. The resource includes a variety of exercises and strategies, including fill-in-the-blank, true or false, fact or opinion, vocabulary questions and puzzles. There is an answer key and a glossary at the back of each book, and a chart for noting student scores is provided. These resources could be used for teaching map skills or for introducing explorers.

- Alberta Education strongly recommends that teachers preview this resource. Careful consideration should be given to the sensitivities of both the student audience and the community.
