### **1. Call for Proposals - Supporting Innovative Classrooms**

Alberta Education is seeking proposals to research innovative practices in the areas of leadership development for the effective use of technology and technology management in Alberta school jurisdictions. This Call for Proposals supports recent investments in school technology, including three-year funding for Innovative Classrooms announced in Budget 2008 and funding for technology infrastructure and classroom technology announced in January 2008.

This Call for Proposals is open to all publicly funded school jurisdictions and charter schools. The deadline for submissions is Monday, October 27, 2008 at 12:00 Noon. A copy of the Call is available online on the Learning and Technology website at <http://www.lnt.ca/>.

### **2. Emerge One-to-One Learning Initiative Update**

Alberta Education hosted its second Emerge One-to-One Laptop Learning summer institute in Calgary on August 21 and 22. Approximately 200 delegates attend sessions on the use of Web 2.0 tools in the classroom, digital citizenship, leadership in one-to-one environments, and technical solutions for wireless learning environments.

## 6. LearnAlberta.ca Updates

On August 21, 2008, Learning Technologies Branch launched the pre-release version of the LearnAlberta.ca website, <http://new.LearnAlberta.ca>. The pre-release site has a new look, additional feature, more content and provides Alberta teachers with access to the digital

learning and teaching supports they need. The pre-release version includes:

- The same online learning and teaching resources from the previous version of LearnAlberta.ca, Online Guides to Implementation, and Tools4Teachers;
- The ability for teachers to create a personal account that provides access to licensed resources and the ability to create a personal “My Workspace” where they can save, annotate, and share lists of resources;
- A change in the way visitors enter the site. Visitors will be required to enter their username and password only when accessing a licensed resource or when accessing “My Workspace”; and
- A new feature that will allow visitors to locate resources within the context of the Program of Studies.

In September and October, both the old and pre-release versions of LearnAlberta.ca will be available to provide a smooth transition for those who rely on the website.

The existing website will remain up and running with the same quality digital learning resources available in English and French. It will continue to be accessible through [www.LearnAlberta.ca](http://www.LearnAlberta.ca) address. Users can check back weekly to see how the new LearnAlberta.ca site continues to evolve.
